June has been another exciting and busy month in school. Our learners have embraced the Summer Term Curriculum as geographers, historians, mathematicians, authors and scientists. It has been wonderful for our them to once again be able to set off on new educational visits enabling them to apply their learning beyond the classroom.

Year 4 Liverpool Visit

As part of Y4's Geography Liverpool unit, enrichment experiences this term have developed cultural capital and provided a bespoke curriculum for our learners. On Thursday 23rd June, our Y4 learners completed a fieldwork visit to the city of Liverpool. The learners were extremely engaged on the trip and were enthusiastic to develop their classroom learning. A visit to the Albert docks allowed learners to identify the changes in physical and human features over time; a walk to see the start of the Leeds Liverpool Canal and how this now extends into the docks developed their understanding of trade; and visits to the Museum of Liverpool and Martime Museum consolidated their learning about the role of the docks in shaping the development of the city of Liverpool.

Whilst exploring the River Mersey, a team of archaeologists were excavating the site where four houses were extremely damaged during the Liverpool Blitz in 1940. Our learners demonstrated the powerful learner attribute of curiosity by asking thoughtful and relevant questions and were very interested to view what had been found so far.

The learners thoroughly enjoyed their day and a positive experience was had by all.









Year 4 Timestable

This month, Year 4 learners completed their SAT Multiplication Test in school. Our 3 classes have been practising hard all year to be ready and were well prepared for the test. The test consisted of 25 multiplication questions in which learners had 6 seconds to answer each. Our use of Timestables Rockstars at Lomeshaye has helped us greatly to improve the acquisition of multiplication facts and so far this school year, Lomeshaye learners have answered over 4 million questions correctly! Can we make it to 5 million by the end of the Summer term?

Story Surprise!

On Friday 24th June, a group of learners from across the School had an exciting opportunity to visit the Canal. Here, they met a fantastic storyteller called Urusla who engaged the learners with some exciting and creative stories all based around the Canal. These unusual and innovative stories were even more special as they were told from memory rather than from a physical book! They included rhyme, humour, repetition and dance which allowed for a unique and interactive experience. Learners also had the chance to read a book for pleasure, sitting on comfy beanbags while enjoying their favourite stories! The first lucky learners to attend were a group of year 5 learners, who were joined by learners from Whitefield. This enabled the learners who will be joining our school in September to interact with our future year 6 learners, helping to ensure a smooth transition and begin reading partnerships within school!



Year 6 Transition

Year 6 have visited their new high schools and are taking part in transition activities to prepare them for their new school setting.

In addition to in school transition support, all year 6 learners have participated in a bespoke workshop 'let's talk transitions' with our Wellbeing Warriors partners who specialise in promoting and nurturing children's mental health. The workshops focused on enhancing a positive experience to the transition into Secondary school for Year 6 children, whilst exploring worries and anxieties that are attached to this experience and transition, it allows for the children to positively explore their own thoughts and feelings, along with their friends and peers in becoming physically and mentally prepared and ready for their next chapter. The workshops have also encouraged the development of positive coping strategies, enabling the learners to become better equipped with skills and tools for managing this transition in becoming a more confident resourceful young person.


